Activities:

Bunny Color Matching – Print a simple bunny outline on different colored paper. Have the kids match the same colored pom-pom to each bunny. For extra fun, have them use tongs or clothespins to help build fine motor skills!

Ear Craft – Create a construction paper headband and attach construction paper ears of any shape.

Bunny Tail Painting – Give kids paint and paper and allow them to use cotton balls as “bunny tails” to paint with.
